



Did you know?

What is the correct way to list your painting dimensions for an exhibition entry?

First, place your painting in the correct orientation of how you'd like to view it and measure height first and the width second.

Example: A vertical painting on an 8x10 paper would be correctly entered as 10" high by 8" width NOT 8" x 10". Basically, the left side of the painting is the "height" and the top dimension (left corner to the right corner) is the "width."

Painting dimensions:

6" x 10"

width 10" Painting dimensions:

10" x 6"

height 10" width

width 6"



The architecture of the museum is inspired by an Egyptian temple. In the gardens around the museum there are other interesting buildings, plants including pampas grass, trees, and statues with an Egyptian theme. We can sit anywhere in the gardens, but have been asked not to block walkways.

Directions: From 880, take either Bascom or The Alameda to Naglee, turn left if coming from Bascom, right if on The Alameda, and go to the corner of Park. Street parking or there is a parking lot at the corner of Naglee and Chapman. Facilities inside the museum.

General Information:

Since a couple of the sites are remote where mobile service may be absent, the coordinators may be unreachable, or GPS inaccurate, please check instructions before heading out. 


CREATING A DYNAMIC FIGURE

EXCERPTED FROM "THE SIMPLE SECRET TO BETTER PAINTING" BY GREG ALBERT

The human body is an appealing challenge for artists and is their most enduring subject. It exhibits a marvelous agility, articulation and expression. In particular, the body has a dynamic balance that makes it a perfect subject for artistic composition.



When the weight of the body is supported evenly on both legs, the body is in static balance. Notice how the divisions suggested by the body's inner frame are parallel.



appears dynamic.

Dynamic

The body is bilaterally symmetrical. The right side mirrors the

left from head to toe, making the body naturally balanced.

However, the potential for movement is so strongly

suggested in its form that even when the body is static, it

When the body shifts weight to one leg, the classic contrapposto position, the body is in dynamic balance. The divisions suggested by the body's inner frame are no longer parallel. This pose complies with the ONE RULE OF COMPOSITION: Never make any two intervals the same and is more interesting.



Dynamic shapes radiate energy

These shapes suggest a definite mood. They are dynamic and generate visual interest. The left and right sides of the body vary considerably even though the body itself is symmetrical in design.

Think of the figure as a shape. What makes any shape more interesting applies to the figure as well. Don't let colors and surface details make you unaware of the overall shape of the figure.




A TRIANGLE SHAPE IS STATIC

Look at the figure as an abstract shape. Does the figure fit into one of the boring shapes: a circle, square, or equilateral triangle? Does its shape have a vertical, horizontal or oblique thrust? Does it have "innies and outies" that give it interesting complexity?

Edward Hopper is widely acknowledged as the most important realist painter of twentieth-century America. But his vision of reality was a selective one, reflecting his own temperament in the empty cityscapes, landscapes, and isolated figures he chose to paint. His work demonstrates that realism is not merely a literal or photographic copying of what we see, but an interpretive rendering. read more
